Definition of Landscape

Landscape comprises the visible features of an area of land, including the physical elements of landforms such as (ice-capped) mountains, hills, water bodies and living elements of land cover.

ENGLISH

In term 5 and 6 we will be studying a mixture of fiction and non - fiction texts that are linked to our project work 'Landscapes'. We will be considering the question 'What is the purpose of art?' and as part of our work we shall be studying 'The Lost Thing' by Shaun Tan and thinking about what is beautiful to one person may not have the same significance to another. Our writing focus will include writing in role as the main character in 'The Lost Thing' and writing explanation texts, biographies and an autobiography linked to the artists and artwork that we are studying. As part of our whole class reading, we will be studying 'The Lady of Shalott' and considering the landscape that the poem is set in. We will read a wide range of texts - fiction and non-fiction - to practise reading for different purposes and to identify themes and conventions within these texts. These texts will form the basis and inspiration for our writing and be used to extend vocabulary. We will also focus on specific grammar and punctuation, applying them to the different genres that we are writing. Children's understanding of grammar, punctuation and vocabulary will be developed throughout the year during all topics and handwriting will be practised frequently.

SCIFNCE

In the first term, we will learn about Earth and space. This will provide the children the opportunity to star-gaze by learning more about the Earth and the celestial bodies in our solar system. Starting with an exploration of each planet - from Mercury to Neptune - we will then explore how scientific ideas surrounding Earth's movement and placement have changed and developed over time. The children will complete an assortment of fascinating Mission Assignments to deepen their understanding of the Moon, time zones and the night and day cycle.

R.E.

Our topic this term is Buddhism. Our enquiry question is: 'How did Buddha teach his followers to find enlightenment? We will learn about where the religion originated, their places of worship, the routines and rituals of Buddhist monks as well as the importance of meditation and discipline.

ART & DT

In Art we will be studying a variety of artists that have been inspired to create landscapes and experimenting with the techniques (line, space, value, form, colour, shape and texture) that they have used to create our own images. We will research biographies for each artist and write explanations of the techniques that they have used. We will be working in our beautiful sketch books and working towards a final exhibition of our work.

FRENCH

In French we will be learning about the seasons, the weather and also hobbies and holidays. 😊

MATHEMATICS

In Maths, we will continue to master our understanding of fractions whilst revisiting and ensuring that our use of the formal methods of multiplication and division are secure. We will deepen our understanding of measurements and shape and solve problems and reason within context. We will also move onto Geometry and explore the properties of 2D and 3D shape, coordinates, reflections and angles. As always, we will continue practising times tables on Times table Rock Stars.

P.E.

In P.E., we will be developing our skills in Athletics and Outdoor Games including Cricket this term. Every Friday, Beech class will work with Sports Cool to develop their athletic, fielding and batting skills (in preparation for Sports Day next term). Fingers crossed that the weather will be lovely and that we can get outside lots! We will also be taking part in our Federation Dance workshops and performance.
