### **CURRICULUM**

At Iford and Kingston CE School, we follow the Skylark Federation Curriculum - a meaningful, purposeful, and locally relevant approach rooted in the rich history, geography, and creativity of East Sussex.

Our project-based curriculum uses these subjects as drivers, enabling children to immerse themselves in learning while developing subject-specific skills in a structured, age-appropriate way. Through this, children learn to analyse and understand the world around them.

We place children at the heart of their learning, nurturing key attitudes such as resilience, resourcefulness, and cooperation. Our teachers bring the National Curriculum to life by connecting subjects through whole-school projects that inspire and engage.

The curriculum is divided into three stages:

- Early Years Foundation Stage EYFS: from ages 4-5
- Key Stage 1: from ages 5-7
- Key Stage 2: from ages 7-11







## **SCHOOL STAGES**

#### **Early Years Foundation Stage**

The Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum is based on the Government's Early Learning Goals with seven areas of learning:

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Literacy
- Mathematics

- Expressive Arts and Design

The children in Early Years are also taught Religious Education. In Early Years we use Tapestry software to communicate with families.

## **ENRICHED CURRICULUM**



#### **Trips and Experiences**

We always look for ways to enrich the curriculum and bring learning to life. Our pupils have taken part in immersive Roman days, visited Butser Ancient Farm, taken part in water sports at Cuckmere Haven, visited Lewes Castle and much more.

#### Residential

Our Year 6 pupils attend Bowles Activity Centre each year, accompanied by Year 6 pupils from across the Skylark Federation. This is a great opportunity for spending time with pupils from other schools before they head off to secondary school.



#### **PTFA**

Our supportive PTFA run a variety of events across the year including a Christmas Tree Sale, a Firework Evening and a Summer Fair. All parents/carers are automatically members of the PTFA. The PTFA helps to foster closer links between home and school and is an excellent way to bring staff, parents/carers and friends together socially in support of the school.

#### **Events**

Throughout the year we have a range of exciting events including Harvest Festival at our local church, Christmas Nativity, an Art Open House, a KS2 summer production and more besides.



#### Clubs

Our pupils have the opportunity to partake in an orchestra, a choir, coding, athletics, art, football, Forest School using our wonderful grounds and a range of other activities.

### ENRICHED CURRICULUM

#### **Sport**

Pupils at Iford and Kingston take part in a range of sporting activities as well as accessing regular inter-federation and Lewes area events.

#### Music

We offer a range of outside providers for musical instrument lessons, including guitar, violin, cello, piano, keyboard and clarinet in addition to the music sessions which form part of our Skylark Curriculum offer.

#### **Health and Wellbeing**

The wellbeing of pupils and staff is central to our ethos. We promote physical health through outdoor activities and a healthy eating policy.

Staff are trained to identify and support emotional and behavioural needs, with concerns recorded on a whole-school monitoring system. Children are encouraged to share worries either directly or via a 'Worry Box', and we work closely with families to ensure consistent support at home and school. Additional nurture support is available from trained practitioners.

Every class engages in age-appropriate discussions around personal, social, and relationship education, and calming strategies drawn from yoga and mindfulness are used to help children manage their emotions and wellbeing. We use the *Let's Talk* PSHE curriculum which creates a culture of outstanding learning behaviours. The lessons build the children's resilience and give them the tools to tackle life's challenges with curiosity and confidence.







## **EARLY YEARS**

Starting school is a significant moment in every child's life, and at Iford and Kingston, we are committed to making it a positive, nurturing, and exciting experience.

#### Building Strong Foundations

We begin building relationships with children and families before they even start school. Our staff liaise with children's pre-school settings to understand each child's unique learning journey. Home visits take place so we can talk with your family in a familiar setting - this helps build trust before children start school and helps us tailor our approach to meet individual needs from day one.

#### Smooth and Supportive Transition

Children are invited to attend specially organised transition events, giving them the chance to explore their new environment, meet staff, and begin forming friendships. These experiences help children feel confident and familiar with their surroundings before their first day.

#### Purposeful Learning Environment

Our Early Years classroom and outdoor space are carefully designed to be stimulating, safe, and engaging. We continually update and adapt our learning environment to ensure it supports exploration, creativity, and curiosity. We are especially proud of our outdoor area and school grounds, which offer rich opportunities for imaginative play, physical development, and nature-based learning.

#### \* Learning Through Purposeful Play

We believe that purposeful play is central to learning in the Reception year. Through play, children develop essential skills such as communication, problem-solving, resilience, and independence. Our curriculum is designed to spark curiosity and encourage children to take ownership of their learning.

#### <sup>□</sup> ✓ Year 6 Buddy System

To support a smooth transition into school life, each Reception child is paired with a Year 6 buddy. This special relationship helps younger children feel safe, welcomed, and confident as they settle in. Buddies play together, share stories, and help guide Reception pupils through their first year - building friendships and fostering a strong sense of community across the school.



## SCHOOL-BASED NURSERY

We are very proud of our recently opened Little Saplings Nursery. This is a bright and joyful space where little learners take their first steps into the world of education.

Full of laughter, creativity, and curiosity, our nursery is designed to spark imaginations and build confidence through play, exploration, and gentle routines. Children aged 2 plus are welcomed into a caring environment where they feel safe, happy, and excited to learn.

With strong links to our Reception class and wider school community, our nursery offers the perfect springboard into school life - and plenty of muddy puddles, storytime snuggles, and big smiles along the way!

## INCLUSION AND ENGAGEMENT

How We Engage With Families:

- Parent/carer consultations: Teachers meet with families to discuss achievements, challenges, and next steps.
- **Clear communication:** Weekly bulletin, regular newsletters, updates, and notices keep families informed and connected to school life.
- Workshops and events: We host learning showcases and parent/carer workshops to share strategies and celebrate learning.
- **Open-door policy:** We encourage families to speak with staff about any concerns or questions.
- Online platforms: We use Tapestry in the Early Years to share learning updates, making communication easy and accessible.

By leading with clarity and care, we ensure that every child is supported both at school and at home.

I am incredibly proud of the success and opportunities the federation provides for all our children.






