
Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum

A Happy Start to School

Half day sessions for 2 days - Monday 9th and Tuesday 10th September

Your child will be in school for either a morning (Group A) or an afternoon (Group B).

- Smaller groups so we can all get to know each other.
- Morning session plus lunch time Wednesday 11th September
- All children have experience of lunch times before full time.
- Please provide a packed lunch for your child
- All children will attend full time from Thursday 14th September.
- If you feel your child would benefit from being part time for a little longer, please speak to us.
- We want starting school to be a positive and happy next step for all children.



A day in Maple Class

8.30-8.45 Parents can bring children into Maple Class, help to settle them and say goodbye.

8:45-9:00 Self-initiated play inside/outside

9.00 - 9.20 Phonics - Sounds Write

9.20 - 9.45 - Exercise then maths or literacy direct teaching

9.45 - 10.15 - Learning Choice - teacher led focus groups and self-chosen play

10.15 - 10.30 Playtime on the big playground - Independent of the rest of the school for the first couple of weeks

10.30 - 11.00 Snack and circle time

11.00 - 12.00 Direct teaching of maths or literacy and learning choice

12:00-1:00 Lunch time

1:00-1:15 Register and show and tell

1:15-2.30 Direct teaching - topic - 1:1 Reading, teacher led focus groups /learning choice

2.30 - 2.45 Tidy and play on the big playground

2.45 - 3.15 Get ready to go home and story
